Viral game helps David Cameron scupper Heathrow third runway plans

A new viral game has a cartoon David Cameron throwing dynamite to halt construction of the third Heathrow runway – while Gordon Brown chases him around in a tank.

The fun game called RunwayRampage.co.uk has been created in response to Cameron's pledge to [scrap the project](#) if he wins power.

T-Enterprise's managing director Sadia Chishti said: "There can be few people in support of this runway apart from some airlines and a couple of builders who will want the contract.

"We're fully behind the environmentalists, campaigners and the people of Sipson, the village that will be destroyed if the project goes ahead. The best way to win the fight is to support the one man who can stop it from happening – David Cameron."

She added: "It's pretty amusing watching Cameron run around the construction site with Gordon Brown chasing him in a tank, but we thought this fun game would be the best way to raise even more awareness and show our support."

In the free game, you control a caricature of Cameron using the arrow keys on your keyboard.

He must run around the runway to pick up dynamite, then throw it at cement mixers and destroy them.

But if Gordon Brown and his tank get to Cameron, he drops the dynamite and you lose points off your score.
